Waste Reduction

Citizens for a Clean Community originally focused on helping Pickens County manage their waste. They worked with the county to strategize and plan how to reduce waste and limit the community's environmental impact.

Today, KPB still works closely with the county as well as local businesses, organizations, and community event sponsors to assist with recycling efforts.

Beautification

Keep Pickens Beautiful has focused on beautification projects throughout the county, including installing a Memorial Garden in Lee Newton Park, painting historical murals in Jasper, Talking Rock, and Marble Hill, and most recently, creating sustainable gardens through our Edible Jasper gardens.

In addition to our own projects, we recognize the extraordinary efforts of residents and businesses with our Green Awards. The Green Ribbon is awarded to those who reduce their environmental impact through sustainable practices. The Green Thumb is awarded to those who beautify the community with their gardening or landscaping.

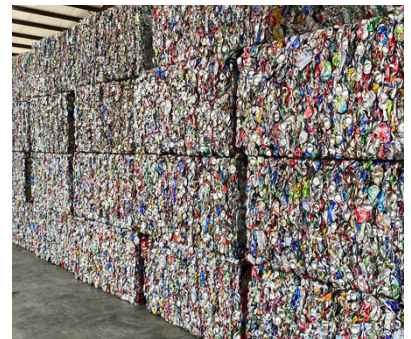
So much more....
